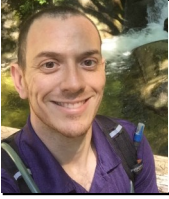

Trinity United Methodist's Candlelight Concerts host Mike and Val James, Port Townsend singers and instrumentalists, who will be performing at **Trinity United Methodist Church** on **Thursday, April 23rd at 7:00 PM** for one set with no intermission.

The performance will also be streamed live at <https://trinityumcpt.org/> where you will find a link for the Candlelight Concerts Online and ways to donate.

Admission to the concert is **free** (really!), with a suggested donation of \$15 per person. You are most welcome to attend whether you choose to donate or not. Half the proceeds will go to NAMI Jefferson County. They are a nonprofit, grassroots, self-help, support, education, and advocacy organization for people with severe and persistent mental illnesses and their family members and friends. Their mission is to empower families and individuals living with mental illness to better understand and cope with the special challenges posed by this kind of illness.

Mike and Val James will be performing an evening of music that they term a "Mixed Bag" – a collection of songs which cover different eras and styles. If you're fond of those lovable jazz standards, classic folk with a flair, or originals with an unexpected twist, you'll enjoy this concert! Mike and Val have performed to a variety

of audiences in concerts, festivals, and private venues in the northwest and internationally for over 25 years. They accompany themselves on guitar(s) and also enjoy performing with numerous musicians in the Port Townsend area. They will be accompanied by Bruce Cannavaro on bass. Their broad musical styles range from the

traditional, to 1940's, through 1980's. Their music has influences from Folk, Blues, Jazz, Maritime, and includes originals, even songs for kids.

Mike James is a retired educator/counselor who lives with his wife, Val, in Port Townsend, Washington. He grew up in Michigan and moved to the Seattle area in 1983. He has been involved in music all his life and enjoys performing solo or with others at various venues, including concerts, festivals, or backyard jams. Everything from jazz to folk, to maritime and music

for kids are fair game to him.

Val James, whose mother sang with Bing Crosby on the radio and in films, just can't get those wonderful tunes out of her head. She recently released a CD "Just Makin' It Up" which includes all original tunes.

Trinity United Methodist Church is located at 609 Taylor Street, across from the Community Center, in Uptown. Attendees should plan on arriving early – doors will open at 6:30. Masks are encouraged for in-person attendees. ■

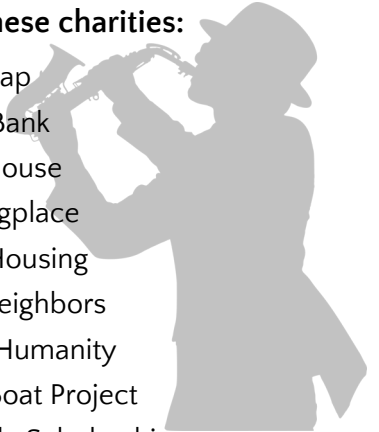

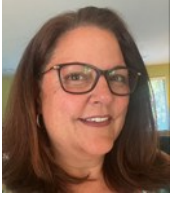

## STAFF PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE

**The** Staff Parish Relations Committee is the only confidential committee in our church but that doesn't mean it needs to be a mystery! SPRC serves as the church's personnel and human resources body, supporting both staff and congregation. During our most recent evaluation with Tony, we requested that he document the many hours he works as our pastor, beyond his office hours and Sunday services.

As expected, this confirmed that he is consistently working well beyond his three-quarter time status. Play practice, party planning, trouble shooting, pulling the photo directory together and visiting parishioners in their home or health care facility are all tasks he does knowing he's working overtime and without pay but with a generous spirit. SPRC believes it would be prudent to explore the possibility of a part-time assistant to help manage administrative and logistical responsibilities, as paying him as a fulltime pastor would add \$20,000 to our budget (given the \$9000 we must pay for the required insurance).

**But first things first...** Our music program is highly regarded and an integral part of our worship service and outreach. Therefore, it is of utmost concern that our much-appreciated accompanist, vocal and bell choir director, Diane Thompson, has resigned from all her positions, as of Easter Sunday. In December we recognized her 10 years of service with us! We are deeply grateful for her contributions. Here's to her well-deserved retirement.

**Now we can use your help** identifying talented folks that may be interested in any of these vacated roles and creative ways to compensate them (unless we find a talented volunteer or two!). You may contact me at 360-821-8451 with any leads. **We have every intention of maintaining both choirs**, but the current budget does not have much wiggle room. Members have graciously stepped up to help the choirs finish the season and fill in as accompanists, for the Sunday service, until the positions can be filled. Another testament to the talent and generosity of our members!

Finally, the SPRC remains committed to fostering healthy relationships between the staff, pastor and congregation. We strive to ensure that staff feel valued and supported and the congregation is getting their spiritual needs met. Of course, the success of any of that relies heavily on open, honest and timely conversation when issues arise. We also aim to show our staff how much they are appreciated. As part of that commitment, SPRC collects a LOVE offering at Christmas time and celebrates them in the spring with a **Staff Appreciation Day**. If you'd like to contribute to our spring event, please note "Staff Appreciation" in a check or Vanco payment. We'll make good use of it!

I want to thank Sarah Heiner for her service to the SPRC, as she has just resigned to take care of personal matters. Her knowledge and experience have been much appreciated. ■

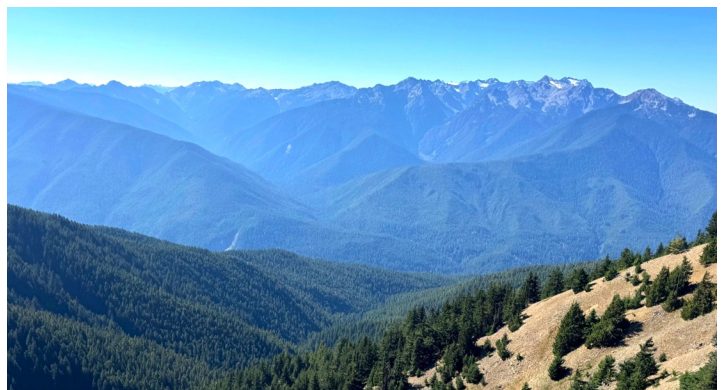


## TRINITY HIKING GROUP

### FOOD BANK COLLECTION

The Food Bank tells us that their biggest need right now is protein, so in addition to any other food donations you would like to make, we are emphasizing one type of protein each month (in "shelf-stable" or nonperishable containers) that we'll deliver to the Food Bank. There is a basket in the foyer to place your donations. **April's emphasis is Your Choice.** If you want to write a check, **please make it out to TRINITY UMC and write 'Food Bank' in the memo.**

### MEDICAL KIT IN ENTRY

**Remember: we have a full MEDICAL KIT** - including FIRST AID SUPPLIES - in the entry. Look for the label on the right hand side of the big cabinet.



### HEARING ENHANCEMENT TECHNOLOGY IS AVAILABLE

Hearing enhancement technology is available. We have a Hearing Loop System that works in the main sanctuary (not the balcony or side room). Hearing loop systems transmit sound from a microphone directly into listeners' hearing aids or cochlear implants, free from ambient or background noise. You may need to ask your provider if your hearing aid has a 'telecoil' or 't-coil', and have them program or activate it for you.

### LARGE PRINT BULLETINS

We now have a few Large Print bulletins each Sunday. You can ask the Greeter for one when you enter the church on Sundays.

### T-SHIRTS

If you'd like a Trinity t-shirt Pastor Tony can make you one for a cost of \$6.30 (covers ink and high quality iron-on transfer).

All you need to do is bring him a blank shirt or sweatshirt of your choice (needs to be at least 50% cotton...100% is the best) and pick which design here you'd like. Any color will work, but white and lighter colors work best.



Tony will collect shirts every Sunday and return the finished shirts the following Sunday. (Larger images can be found in Pastor Tony's previous e-mail and our weekly e-mail Office Updates.)

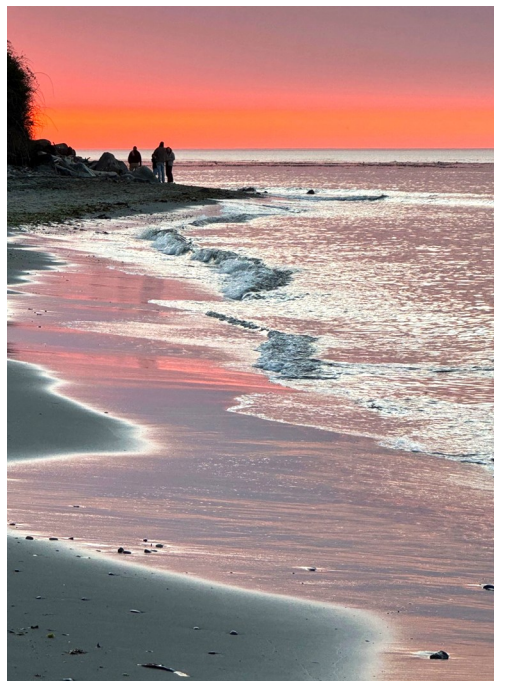

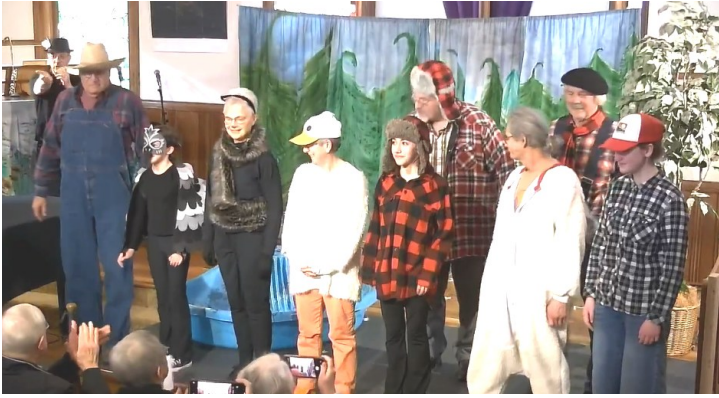
