#### SPOTLIGHT ON STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE

Trinity's strategic planning committee has been meeting monthly since late summer, 2023. We meet directly following the Sunday service with a small break between the service and the meeting so that our members can be part of the post-service fellowship downstairs. But then it's back to work!

We started our work together by getting to know each other better; to hear what people thought of our church and to share our aspirations for the future of Trinity. We then did a Strength, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT) analysis together. That document is available upon request. We shared a document on the basics of strategic planning, as well. We spent a meeting looking at how to match the process of designing a church project with a larger strategic focus on increasing our Christian discipleship. Our most recent meeting in October was spent putting on paper the five (5) strategic topics we felt were impera-

tive to address as a church. Each member submitted (or will soon!) a worksheet that captured their ideas. I'm now looking at those worksheets and capturing the common strategic ideas/projects. See the list that follows:

- · Building future fiscal sustainability
- Continual expansion of our music ministry
- Increasing discipleship through an international mission trip
- Upgrading our kitchen to better serve our congregational and community ministries.
- Continue to grow our youth ministry.
- Increasing access for all through ADA improvements to our facility
- Deepening our emphasis on being a reconciling congregation in our community ministries

Oprah's list of favorite things for 2023 is out and the list includes Christmas gifts such as Lollia Elegant Bubble Bath (\$46), Le Creuset Bread Oven (\$300), and Zola Bakes Purple Ombré Rainbow Cookies (\$49). There is so much pressure at this time to buy the perfect gift for those we love, and it can make the Christmas season stressful.

I used to spend so much time looking for Christmas gifts for my sister, her 4 children, and her husband and ensuring that I got it ordered through Amazon Prime shipping so that the gifts would make it in

time. Most of the time the gifts were a welcome treasure for a day or 2, but then like with my kids, the presents lost their magic and ended up buried away in a closet or taken to Goodwill. So, a few years ago I decided to do something different through UMCOR.

UMCOR is the United Methodist Committee on Relief and is the global humanitarian aid and development organization of the United Methodist Church (UMC). UMCOR is a nonprofit 501(c)3 organization operated under the auspices of the General Board of Global Ministries. One hundred percent of donations are directed to an earmarked project or relief effort. UMCOR works through programs that address hunger, poverty, sustainable agriculture, international and domestic emergencies, refugee and immigrant concerns, global health issues, and transitional development. These programs are categorized into three major areas: Humanitarian Relief / Disaster Response, Sustainable Development and Global Health (in collaboration with UM Global Ministries).

If you go to the website <a href="www.umcmission.org/umcor/">www.umcmission.org/umcor/</a> you will find all of the many projects that UMCOR is supporting around the world. Each project gives pictures and a brief story about how that project is changing the lives of people around the world for the better. It's truly amazing how much good work that the United Methodist Church is doing!

So, rather than find the most popular product on Amazon I simply donate an amount to a project, print off the information about the project, and send it in a Christmas card to her family. In the card I let them know

that the gift was made in honor of them as a Christmas present.

I was a little nervous the first year I did this as I thought they'd miss the toys. I was somewhat surprised when they received the card and thanked me for their Christmas gift. They were excited to know that they had helped bring clean water to a village in Africa. Now they look forward to read about the new project I chose for them each year.

So, if you are stressed out about what to get that special someone then I invite you to join me and others in the church who have started to donate to UMCOR projects in lieu of gifts. From my experience people will truly be grateful for the honor and the information about how their Christmas gift is helping others. Additionally, it will help many to remember what the meaning of Christmas truly is.

Our general meeting on November 10th was held in the Fellowship Hall with our usual potluck. In attendance, besides the four officers were Dalene Edgar, Ross Mayeda, Margaret Engle, Chris Walvatne, Beth Kissin-

ger, and Vicki Long.

Business items were discussed by Sarah. 1) Signing up to provide stocking stuffers (for the stockings made by Marlene and decorated at our last meeting) for the 4 children at Dove House

2) Signing up for the afterchurch Thanksgiving potluck on November 19 3) Issues with the front door and the

recent appearance by Sarah, Pastor Tony, and Kathy O'Shea at the Board of County Commissioners to discuss our church's withdrawal of our grant request for ADA funds from the county's subcommittee. Sarah explained briefly that this was to avoid any potential for slowing down the project to repair the door further. We have most of the funds needed for an electric door opener, but Sarah is also actively looking into repairing the side of the new door that does not close correctly, which is a separate issue.

Zoe Ann then gave her Treasurer's report which was all good news! We now, thanks to our members' donations, have \$1122.18 in our bank account, making us able to fund our speakers' organizations of choice with \$100 each over this year, as well as make our usual Christmas donations of \$100 to both Dove House and Jumping Mouse. The latter two donations were approved by a show of hands at the meeting.

Sarah then congratulated Bess Anne and Debra for a job well-done, along with Marlene (out ill today) with our recent Harvest Craft Fair and Bake Sale. Zoe Ann reported that it is looking like we will have made well

more than \$3000, most of which hopefully will be used on a new floor for our kitchen.

Bess Anne was then invited to bring the group up to speed on what's happening with our kitchen. She re-

viewed the detailed paper-work for the county, which she completed, and the groundwork laid out over the years by Donna Purnell, Marlene, and many others to reach our goal successfully of being a designated Donor Kitchen as well as a Donor Food Distributing Organization. Bess Anne and Bill Brock will be meeting with the county inspectors on Monday November 13th at 9

the county in Monday Noven am for the final walk-through inspection.

(I am happy to report that as of this writing, we passed our inspection and the trustees will be getting down to the nuts and bolts of having a kitchen committee and all the ongoing documentation etc. that will be needed to maintain it. This is big!! We can now cook at the church and take hot meals to the Legion Shelter, or wherever, as needed, among other potential service opportunities.)

Debra then introduced our speaker for the day; East Jefferson Habitat for Humanity's long-time executive director, Jamie Maciejewski. Prior to her talk we had a devotion from Deb from the book "What I Learned from God While...Gardening" by Niki Anderson and Christine Bolley. It centered on how some human interactions are similar to trying to force a flower to bloom out of season. Sarah then delivered a short prayer centered on Peace, for grace.

After eating Jamie gave us a great talk. She highlighted that Trinity and El Habitat have been entwined since


his yard was filled with fruit trees, flowers and a waterfall with a large pond filled with large koi fish.


