PASTOR'S LOG By Pastor Tony Brown

When we were in TN recently for Thanksgiving we drove past the exit for The Virgin Pocket Wilderness near Crossville and I told Miriam and Lydia how amazing it was (we didn't have enough time to do the hike). The Virgin Falls Pocket Wilderness area south west of Crossville is hands down one of my favorite hikes in East Tennessee. It is

an 8 mile hike that descends hundreds of feet passing 4 waterfalls along the way. This picture is of the largest of the falls: Virgin Falls, which is 110 feet tall. While they are big waterfalls, the most amazing thing about these four waterfalls is that they all spill into sink holes into the earth and eventually reemerge combining all together into the Caney Fork River. On the hike you will find yourself strolling along a fast moving stream when all of he sudden it falls over the edge of a cliff and disappears into the earth, not to be seen again until it flows out of the ground into the river. It is an incredible jewel of a place with extremely rare geological features.

I like the fact that these four waterfalls are all visible individually and then disappear for awhile only to find their fulfillment together in the one river. Big Laurel Falls, Sheep Falls, Big Branch Falls, and Virgin Falls all are unique and beautiful on their own, but so powerful and life giving when they come together.

This reminds me of the Advent season and our tradition of lighting the four candles each Sunday. Each week we witness the lighting of a new candle, and take a moment to pause and reflect on the mystery and truth of what each one of those candles represent; Dec 1st—Hope, Dec. 8th—Peace, Dec. 15th—Joy, and Dec. 22nd—Love. And, each week we see those candles go out, only to reemerge all together on Christmas Eve forming the completed circle encompassing the one Christ candle that is lit. Hope, joy, love, and peace, all find their completion and fulfillment when they reemerge on Christmas Eve through the lighting of the



Christ Candle, and the recognition that all have come together in this one person, Jesus Christ.

That is what the line means in the song O Little Town of Bethlehem when we sing, "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in Thee tonight." In Christ, we find the completed work of God. Christ is the fulfillment of God's work, and is the reason for our hope, peace, joy, and love. When we jump into that mighty river, being baptized in the Spirit through faith in lesus Christ, we wade in the culmination of those four candles and their symbolism. We experience the completion of what the ancients expected and prayed for centuries; the coming reign of Je-

sus Christ, King of Kings, and Lord of Lords.

On Christmas Eve we will gather together at 6pm to light the final candle, the Christ candle. All the other candles point the way to the culmination of our advent season, but on Christmas Eve we will light the final candle. Together we will stand in awe of the mystery of the divine attributes of God being poured fully into the one person of Jesus Christ. A baby in a manger. We hope you will join us!

I am sure that you have noticed that one of our stained-glass windows is missing. This is a good thing. Under the supervision of George Williams, Dahl Glass removed the Benson Short Memorial window, crated it and took it to the studio of Seabeckian Glass Works. The window had sagged, most likely due to the earthquake that affected the Bell Tower. Seabeckian glass will be working to repair the braces and solder where needed as well as repair a couple of cracked panes. No date on its return, but the reports are that all is going very well.

The second thing that you may have noticed is that we are missing one of our chandeliers. This is not a good thing. When a local electrical company was doing work to investigate why no power was getting to the fixture, the glass dome was dropped. We are reaching out to as many antique lighting companies as we can find to look for a replacement dome. No luck so far. We apologize for the lack of light on that side of the sanctuary.

The third item is the elevator. We are awaiting a new circuit board. Unfortunately, we do not have an estimated time of delivery. Hopefully, we will have a Christmas Elevator Miracle.



YOUR PHONE AS A VALUABLE TOOL FOR YOUR SAFETY! By Shirley Williams

At any time, you could fall, have an accident or a health care incident. It would be helpful for those who want to help you, to have access to your health information. For example, the medications you are on, major health issues, such as having diabetes, seizure disorder, allergies, cardiac issues, etc.

Many of us carry "smart phones" that can provide that information to others without knowing your password to it. But first you need to add that data to your phone. First, collect the information on a work sheet, the names of your medication, the health issues that would need immediate attention, and your contact persons. Once you have all that information, then you can start putting it on your phone. The following document may help you get started.

Adding Emergency Information to your **iPhone** lock screen:

1) On the main screen, tap the health icon (little red heart). Then tap your picture (initials) in the upper right corner. At that screen, tap Medical ID. Enter any information or edit any information you want to be available to emergency responders, such as current medications, emergency contacts, location of advanced directive or living will. Be sure to indicate on that screen to share on emergency calls and lock screen.

Adding emergency information to your **Android** Phone:

- 1) Go to lock screen, look for "emergency" then "view Emergency info".
- 2) Fill in the emergency information, then add "emergency contact" on lock screen.

Doesn't apply to your phone? Lock your phone and swipe up to bring up the prompt for your unlock method. Tap on the Emergency or Emergency Call Button. Swiping and tapping the button is how Responders can view your information.




