PASTOR'S LOG

Dear Church,

Our Church Building is such a vital part of the ministry that Trinity plays in Port Townsend. While a church building is not the "church", how our building looks and operates plays a huge part in attracting newcomers. As the United Methodist Hymn tells us "I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together". However, the building and its operational function and upkeep reflects volumes to the public on whether we are welcoming and inviting or not.

In the 12 years I've been here as pastor I have never witnessed the church building and grounds look as beautiful and cared for as it does today. Everything





from the prayer garden to the recent painting has made our building look much more loved and cared for then I have ever seen. This hasn't happened by accident but by the hard work of many dedicated volunteers putting countless hours into it.

What amazes me is that the current plans by our incredible Trustees will only continue to make things better. We currently have plans to continue to approve ADA accessibility, repair stained glass, and continue to improve our kitchen (among many other items). There again are many dedicated volunteers that we are grateful to for all of this.

Again, while the church building is not the church, you can truly get a sense of a congregation by the way the interior and exterior of the building looks. A run down and non-functional building can send the message that the church is tired, old, and doesn't have much passion. A fully functional and clean building and grounds can send the message that we are vibrant and on the move. Think about it this way, if you see a restaurant that is run down and ugly how does that impact your

Tom Melancon

In-Person, Online & On the Air

Trinity United Methodist's Candlelight Concerts host Tom Melancon, a singer and songwriter from Seattle, who will be performing at Trinity United Methodist Church on Thursday, November 14, 2024, at 7:00 PM for one full set with no intermission.

The performance will also be streamed live at https://trinityumcpt.org/concerts/ where you will find a link for the Candlelight Concerts Online and ways to donate. The concert will also be simulcast on KPTZ FM 91.9.

Admission to the concert is **free** (really!), with a suggested donation of \$15 per person. You are most welcome to attend whether you choose to donate or not. Half of the donations from Melancon's concert will be given to the Society of St. Vincent De Paul East Jefferson County, https://svdpejc.org/, whose mission is to respond to the emergency needs of people in our community by offering financial assistance and referrals as necessary.

Tom Melancon grew up in Northern Nevada and played bass guitar with several local bands in Reno, earning notice as an accomplished live performer, recording musician and songwriter. Since moving to the Pacific Northwest over 20 years ago, Tom has continued to play bass guitar with local bands, but also started turning his focus more to songwriting and solo performance.

Tom joined Mark Huff from Nashville, Tennessee, on several PNW tours in 2016 and 2017. In 2019, Tom formed his current band American Flats, a melodic Americana Band with soaring vocals, excellent harmonies and engaging musical performances. American Flats has earned a reputation as a heartfelt, passionate



rock band, playing local venues and festival such as The Showbox, Bite of Seattle and the Royal Room. AF Released their first EP "Nevada" to a sold-out show at the Royal Room in February and is getting quite a bit of play on the streaming platforms.

When Tom plays solo, he brings a mixture of the hardhitting Americana that American Flats delivers along with other heartfelt Folk-Rock songs that he's written and recorded. The vibe is dusky vocals with a hint of the open spaces of Nevada and the heartbreak of being alive in a complicated world.

Trinity United Methodist Church is located at 609 Taylor Street, across from the Community Center, in Uptown. Attendees should plan on arriving early – doors will open at 6:30. Masks are encouraged but not mandatory for in-person attendees.

- 1) **Bill Pay through your bank**—you can have a payment automatically sent every month. Please talk to your bank to find out how to do this they often offer it for free.
- 2) Online through Vanco—the link is on our website: https://trinityumcpt.org/donate/donate-online/. This has a link to our secure Vanco page. (Using a bank account—with routing number—costs Trinity lower fees than credit and ATM cards.)
- 3) **Snail-Mail**—you can mail checks directly to the church: 609 Taylor St, Port Townsend, WA 98368.
- 4) **In person**—and, of course, you can drop cash and checks in the collection plate if you attend in person.




