SPOTLIGHT ON LITURGICAL ART

I found this definition of "Liturgical Art" online: Broadly defined, liturgical art is any work of art that pertains in some way to the rite of Christian worship. This may include the altar, furnishings, vestments, candles, banners, and other ritual objects, plus the architecture. All of these play some role in the divine worship service.

The latest piece of liturgical art is a very colorful cross for the pulpit. I found the inspiration on Pinterest and decided that we needed something like it. I didn't want the cross to have just a rainbow around it as it seems too easy to assume the meaning of a rainbow.

When I work on these paraments, it becomes a meditation for me and a search for how to visualize the messages in our faith. I thought perhaps it is time to talk about my meditations starting with this colorful cross.

Green: I started with the green rays. This is the green season of the liturgical year – also called Common Time. The green symbolizes growth in our faith and thus in our lives.

Blue: The color of the water of life – baptism and the rain that keeps our gardens and forests green.

Blue-Green: This reminded me of one of the many colors of our oceans. Another type of water. One which we need to protect and is so much a part of our lives in the northwest.


Souper Wednesdays



Living in the projects in Knoxville, Tennessee, Heather's mother approaches life with a vivacious ferocity that's both awe-inspiring, and terrifying. Heather's father is the gentle heart of the family, a former Christianpastor-turned-artist who whispers

awake the creative soul of his young daughter.

When a stunning tragedy splits the family apart, Heather is left to face her teenage years broke, fat, and trying to imagine a place for herself in a world that seems designed to diminish her at every turn. But in the rubble of loss she finds the scrappy pride of a survivor, and in the midst of scarcity a sisterhood built upon generosity and hope.

Red: The color of Pentecost and the Spirit coming to the people; to us. Do we let the Spirit into our lives and take it with us after we leave church?

The **grey** and **brown** rays represent the inclusivity of Christ's love. He loves us regardless of our skin color, race, sexuality, gender, or any of the other characteristics which some people use to make faith seem exclusive.

Purple is the color of Advent and Lent. It is the color of royalty. It is also the color of communion wine.

Yellow reminds me of the Easter sunrise. The joy of finding Christ alive that morning and his forgiveness of our sins.

The intensity of the color of some of the rays diminish as they move away from the cross. Do we begin to forget the Sunday message as we move through our busy lives during the week?

My hope is that these pieces of fabric tell you more than just the color of the current liturgical season.

FINANCE COMMITTEE By Zoe Ann Dudley, Finance Chair

We are back in the saddle again, and looking forward to a lovely Fall. Your Finance Committee kept noses to the grindstone, with Lynn's help of course, through the summer. We are happy to report that:

- Income from EOGs, Donations, Rents, and Candlelight Concerts are above YTD budget by \$9,377 or at 108%.
- Expenses are below our budget by \$4,337 or at 96%.
- The fencing in the yard behind the parsonage has been completed, is attractive and well done. All the supplies were donated as well as all the labor. Thank you to all who participated.
- Our Candlelight Concert was a great success in August and we were able to donate \$389 to Jumping Mouse. The remaining income provided \$202 each to our Operating Fund and to our Maintenance Reserve. Thank you to all for attending, enjoying and giving us the opportunity to continue community outreach, as well as providing some income to take care of our Church.
- As of 8/18 our Operating Balance was at \$39,216 and after all monthly expenses, we are holding steady each month. The fulfillment of your

- pledged EOG is what is holding us solid with other donations contributing significantly.
- Our current Loan Balance for our mortgage is \$86,543 at the rate of 3.75%. This loan is held by Faith Foundation Northwest. Our monthly payments are \$1001.00, which we have been able to meet without fail!!

We received a lovely and encouraging message from Rev Mark Galang, our Puget Sound District Superintendent. Trinity is at 58.33% of our annual total contribution to our Conference, which means we have made EVERY monthly payment in accordance with our annual pledge, which is 100% of our expected requirement. Not all churches have been able to maintain this level of contribution and WE HAVE OUR TRINITY FAMILY TO THANK!!

We have the rest of 2023 to look forward to, knowing we go forward with strength, with the Love of each other and holding high the Love we share for our God. Blessing to all and thank you for the opportunity to work among you.

COFFEE - coffee beans in a pint canning jar, cookies (store bought or homemade), chocolate bar or candies, mug, iced coffee drink

TEA - similar to above with special teas, candle in a iar

COZY - mug, individual hot drink mixes, candle in a jar, mittens, socks, twinkle lights, chocolate, essential oil or lotion


