Then came TOAD HALL in N.C., when we bought a property and redesigned the buildings to become a lovely and very successful Bed and Breakfast Inn. In Seattle, I worked at the safe-house for abused women, and had an exciting assignment when I spent a month in Vietnam and China researching tour experiences to be used for American visitors. ## PASTOR'S LOG

Along the Appalachian Trail a weary traveler will find 5 star accommodations throughout the journey. The picture below is one of these prized places of comfort I found close to Roane Mountain in Northeast Tennessee. Now, many may not consider this a luxurious lodging opportunity. Yet, for the tired backpacker this is a well deserved break from the tent that must be pitched each evening. A dry shelter such as this gives the tired feet and often cold and damp body a place of rejuvenation before the trek continues. Some of these even have fire places in them!

We begin the season of Lent this month and many of us are already beginning to think about this long journey to the cross with Jesus. Some of us have found that the trail of sacrifice that leads us to Easter Sunday is a time of spiritual renewal each year. Many of us will give up something during this season as a way to identify with Christ's self sacrificial walk to Calvary. Some of us will add a new spiritual discipline to our routine such as prayer, study, giving, fasting, or serving. However you choose to observe Lent I know that God will bless you for it.

We are going to embark on a journey together. And, just like those through hikers on the 'AT' we need to make sure that we have the opportunity to renew and rejuvenate our souls during this season. There are a few ways that Trinity is providing these opportunities.

On Wednesday March 1st at 6pm we will begin the journey together with an Ash Wednesday service. If you are unable to make this service, don't worry. Participation in the Ash Wednesday service is not necessary, it is only there to provide you a starting point during this season. Think of it as a 'Bon Voyage' event.

Each week during Lent consider attending the Monday noon Bible study or the Lenten Study that Dale Kelley and Nancy Stevens will be leading on Thurs-

days beginning March 9th from 10 am-noon. These opportunities will enable you to feed on the bread of life.

In addition to these opportunities we want to provide you with daily respite from the dark days of Lent. Therefore, we are making available a Lenten Devotional that you can pick up in the entry way of the church. I hope you will consider being proactive during Lent and finding new ways to devote yourself to God and the work of God in our world.

The beauty of the shelter that day I took the photo was not the shelter itself, but the well worn Bible sit-



ting in the window. The way the light illuminated the pages in that dark shelter made me think of the verse from Psalm 119:105 which declares, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

Our path is laid out before us. The shadow of the cross looms over us and grows longer each day as we approach Good Friday. How will

you be sure that you have light in the midst of your journey. Where will you find care for your soul. Will you consider going along with us through this season? Let's discover again that while the journey of life is difficult and dark at times, the light of the Resurrection is already illuminating our paths. For, as the words from the beginning of the book John remind us, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

# “Ringling in the Rain”

## Townsend Bay Ringers

The Townsend Bay Ringers return **Thursday, March 23, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.** for their fourth appearance in the **Trinity United Methodist Church Candlelight Series**. The ten talented local musicians look forward to showering listeners with a variety of memorable tunes around “water-based” themes. The ensemble, which provides outreach into the community through concerts, performances at local churches and retirement homes, comes from diverse backgrounds that include boat building, telecommunications, teaching, acting and textile design.

Prior to moving to Port Townsend, director **Judy Schussler**, was director of music at First Presbyterian Church in Yakima, for 30 years where she directed two handbell choirs. Currently, she is also Choir Director at Trinity United Methodist Church in Port Townsend.

Those unfamiliar with handbell choirs might only associate hearing bells pealing from lofty towers. Many unique ringing techniques, however, have created renewed interest in handbells with many new compositions including classical, jazz, Broadway and rock as well as sacred and original compositions written specifically for handbells. The audience can expect to hear not only lush melodies and harmonies, but unusual percussive sounds that are achieved by means of “shakes”, “swings”, and “mallets” as well as the “martellato” technique of tapping the bells into foam padded tables. Handbell music is like a piano score but each ringer is assigned only three to five bells that

must be integrated into the musical framework. The ten ringers play a total of 51 handbells and 37 choir-chimes requiring a great deal of teamwork with each ringer providing a crucial link in the musical chain.

The March 23rd concert will offer many musical styles and include the unusual pairing of **handbells with saxophonist, Al Thompson**. A selection from **Handel’s “Water Music”** will lead into the second half of the program which will include familiar selections from movies that evoke images of water. The music for **Gene Kelly’s** famous dance scene from **“Singin’ in the Rain”** is especially effective played by handbells. **Disney** fans will enjoy hearing **“Under the Sea”** from **“The Little Mermaid”**. Not to be outdone, Kermit the Frog of **“Muppet Movie”** fame,



will have his say while safely perched on top of a lily pad contemplating **“The Rainbow Connection.”** The group’s “wetland adventure” will come to a rousing conclusion with a “pull-out-all-the-stops” rendition of the spiritual, **“Wade in the Water.”**

Doors open at 6:30 pm, Trinity United Methodist Church, 609 Taylor Street, across from the Community Center, Uptown. Admission is a suggested \$10 donation (children admitted free) to benefit local Port Townsend organizations and Trinity’s music and historic Victorian restoration program. #### From Jeff:

Growing up in Philadelphia my life was full of school sports teams, Luther League, Young Life and becoming an Eagle Scout.

Rebecca and I met in Washington, D.C., where our first jobs were at American Airlines. I was also in school at both American and Georgetown Universities. Then, Uncle Sam took me into his Navy (many long hrs. flying in P-3's) and Rebecca waited for me! During our early years of marriage, in the 60's and '70's, we traveled the world on airline passes. Once, we flew to Istanbul, Turkey just because it was Thanksgiving, and we could! Amazing times for a young couple.

Later I served as a Director of the Travel Industry Association of America, on The US Travel Institute, and at Alaska Geographic Association; also in management at Finnair (the national airline of Finland), at Braniff International Airlines., and at Continental Airlines.

By the 90's, I was traveling all the time, away from our family, and so, as Sr. V.P. of world-wide sales for Continental Airlines, I left the airlines for the passenger cruise line business. I served as President of The Delta Queen Steamboat Co., in New Orleans, and

Cruise West, in Seattle and Alaska. I was a lecturer at U. of New Orleans Hospitality Management School; a Delegate to the Clinton White House Conference on Tourism, and taught “Life Skills” to homeless teenagers at Covenant House in New Orleans. I retired last year, as co-founder, CEO & Vice Chairman of The American Queen Steamboat Co. with its glorious 19th century stern wheeler cruises on the Mississippi and the Columbia Rivers and now serve as a trustee at the Fort Worden Foundation.

Our decision to move one last time, (this makes the 28th!) to P. T. for our retirement has been made even sweeter by joining Trinity. This church strives to be current in today's world while blending the teachings of Jesus in all our changing lives. It is always inclusive. We are grateful to have found this community, church, and Pastor Tony. We are always looking for new friends, travel adventures, good books, movies and plays but no more moving boxes!

## STEEPLE PAINTING UPDATE

The Trustees and the Finance Committee have reviewed our current financial status and have agreed to award both parts of the steeple painting contract to Lyons Painting; and the steeple lighting upgrade awarded to Frederickson Electric. This will result in fresh paint for the Steeple, the Cross and all 4 Peaks; and with functional lighting for the cross.

The cost of the total project is estimated at \$30,100.

### Funding will be as follows:

Steeple Painting Fund: \$20,835

Cash Reserve: \$9,265 (Leaving a Cash Reserve of \$4,750.)

As noted, this will seriously reduce the Cash Reserve fund. Any additional contributions to the Steeple Fund will be very much appreciated.

The painting is scheduled to begin in early April and continue for several weeks. There will be some restrictions for access to the church, but available entrances will be fully marked.



## CORNERSTONE CAMPAIGN CONTINUING COVERAGE...

## FINANCE COMMITTEE

**I** think it might be helpful to see the numbers that had the Finance Committee concerned last Fall, and I include the numbers that show how we were able to close the year fabulously!

- Actual year-to-date **income as of September 2016**: \$117,839
- Year to date **income budget as of September 2016**: \$123,054
- Thus, we were already running **short by \$5215** with only 3 months left in the year!
- Actual year to date income **as of year-end 2016**: \$163,365
- **2016 Year-end income budget** was \$164,072!
- Combine income with the Candlelight Concert income and donations to the Cash Reserve Account (\$2948) and expenses coming in under budget and we ended the year \$7000 ahead!

### January 2017 Financial Report

**(Annual budget is \$170,000. \$14,150 average per month needed)**

**Income \$14,809 (5 Sundays) 104.67% of income budget**  
(Jan. income also included fundraising due to sale of chairs, parsonage rent & bldg. rental income.)

**Expenses: \$14,723 104.06% of expense budget**

**Difference +\$86**

**Apportionments \$1655 monthly, paid 100%**
